

Financial Highlights

AHTF as a 501(C)3 independent foundation relies solely on its generous supporters for revenue. The Foundation continues to be fiscally responsible in controlling its operating costs and maximizing allocations for grants and educational scholarships.

2024 income sources included generous monthly donors and individual donors, as well as support from upper extremity associations, organizations, corporate partnerships, and event underwriting. The projected 2024 income is approximately \$81,000. 2024 non-grant and scholarship-related expenses include fees for our part-time executive director, accounting services, website maintenance, state registration compliance with charitable giving regulations, legal services, and fundraising events. Projected 2024 expenses are approximately \$69,000. 2024 restricted fund expenses included over \$70,000 in Grants and Awards and underwriting of the 2024 ASHT Annual Meeting Scientific Session.

The newly established Jim King Scientific Session Support Fund was established through a generous donation from Jim and Beverly King. Their financial commitment will permit AHTF to provide support for the AHTF Scientific Sessions through 2034.
